How to Install	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will need an Apple ID and a device with iOS8 or above in order to download the Open eBooks app. From the Apple App Store app, search for and install the free Open eBooks app. Once installed, open the Open eBooks app. Tap Accept to agree to the terms of Service Click button, "Log in with Clever" Search for your school Enter USERNAME = Student Number Enter PASSWORD = Date of birth as YYYYMMDD 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will need a Google Play account. From the Google Play Store app, search for and install the Open eBooks app. Once installed, open eBooks app. Tap Accept to agree to the terms of Service Click button, "Log in with Clever" Search for your school Enter USERNAME = Student Number Enter PASSWORD = Date of birth as YYYYMMDD
Browsing the Collection	
<p>Tap the Catalog icon (open book) at the bottom of the screen. You can tap the cover of the book to read a description of the book and borrow the book.</p>	<p>Tap the icon at the top to open up the menu. Select catalog and the browse lanes will appear. You can tap the cover of the book to read a description about the book, download, checkout or place a hold.</p>
<p>Browse Categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Swipe from left to right on the book covers to view the popular and available for the respective category. Scroll up and down to view the different categories. Tap the category titles or More... to view sub categories or a list of all books in the respective category. <p>Browse Category List: Scroll up and down to browse the list of books</p>	
To Find a Title	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tap the Search icon (magnifying glass) in the navigation bar in the upper right corner of the screen. Type the name of the author or title of the book. A list of books matching your search criteria will be displayed. Scroll the list of results to find your book or refine your search. 	
Reading an eBook	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At any time, you can tap the cover of a book and tap Borrow to get the book. When the books has downloaded to your device you simply tap Read to open and read the eBook To exit or navigate to a particular section <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tap the center of the screen to bring up the top menu bar. Tap My Books on the upper left to exit the book Tap the button on the upper right of the top menu bar to bring up the TOC (table of contents), then tap on the section or chapter you wish to open. To change font type, size, contrast or brightness <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tap the center of the screen to bring up the top menu bar. Tap the button (second from the right of the top bar menu). Tap the appropriate control or selection from the options displayed. 	
Sort & Filter Book Lists	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At the list level, tap on Author to change the sort order. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tap Title to sort by title or Tap Author to continue to sort by author At the list level you can also filter the list by <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tapping All to change the attributes to filter on then Tap All or On Hold to filter accordingly 	
Approaching the Maximum Number of eBooks – 10 books maximum at a time	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> How to know how many eBooks you currently have borrowed <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tap the My Books icon at the bottom center of the navigation screen. The list of books you currently have borrowed will appear. Tap Return to return the books. Returning one or more eBooks will allow you to borrow new titles. There is no limit to how many times you can borrow a single title.

2. Open eBooks is now partnering with Clever for easier access. Teachers in Hartford no longer need to sign up with First Book to access codes.
3. Students select “sign in using Clever” and use their Student Number as the username and date of birth (YYYYMMDD) as password.

WHAT IS OPEN EBOOKS?

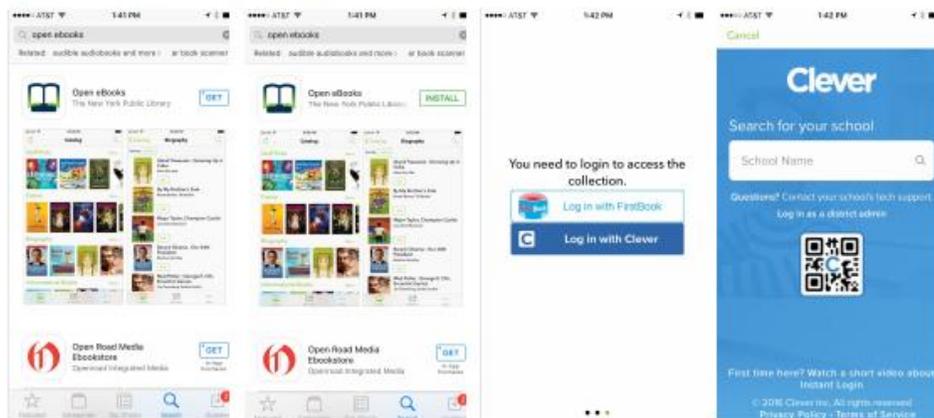
- Goal: encourage a love of reading and serve as a gateway to children reading even more often, whether in school, at libraries, or through other eBook reading apps.
- Contains thousands of popular and award-winning titles, free for children from in-need households. These eBooks can be read without checkouts or holds. Access these eBooks, which include some of the most popular works of the present and past, using the Open eBooks app and read as many as they like without incurring any costs.
- The app is available to low-income youth who is a student in a school or district that serves at least 70% of children from in-need families.
- This initiative provides an additional pathway for students to access reading materials and to read widely. It complements, but does not replace, existing infrastructure and programs that provide access to physical books. Ebook reading is growing rapidly and should be available to all children and youth, regardless of family income.



How do I use Open eBooks?

[Open eBooks](#) is an application that provides a mobile digital library with thousands of popular and award-winning books **free** for you to use at home or at school.

Follow these **four easy steps** to get Open eBooks on any mobile device - including tablets, iPads, and on smartphones of all types.



Step 1: On an iPhone or Android phone, open the app store and type in “open ebooks”

Step 2: Click **GET** then click **INSTALL** to download the app.

Step 3: Open the app and click **Log in with Clever**.

Step 4: Search for the student’s school district to log in with their username and password.

SUPPORTED DEVICES

The app is currently available on iOS and Android. Subsequent versions will be optimized to support as many open platforms as possible, such as desktop version, Google Chromebooks, Kindle, Nook, etc.

Reading Levels

Open eBooks is currently organized into three collections: **early grades, middle grades, and high school**. However, there is currently no way to organize by reading level. There is no way to filter material that may be too mature topically. This is left to the discretion of the teacher, librarian, administrator or parent, as with all reading material.

STUDENT ACCESS

Borrow up to 10 books at a time and replace each book with a new book as many times as they’d like. Checked out books are available for 56 days. To get access to the app, they—or an adult working with them—can download the app and enter credentials provided by a person registered with First Book to enable access to the eBooks.

PRIVACY

Individual readers' activity is not tracked. Reading will be tracked anonymously and in the aggregate. A student’s privacy is paramount and the partners will work tirelessly to ensure that student privacy is maintained at all times.
