Then measure it with a ruler, blocks, legos, or whatever you have around the house. Is it bigger than your foot ?</p> 	<p><u>Dinosaur Shapes</u></p> <p>Cut out a lot of shapes, then use them to make a dinosaur. What shapes did you use? Arts & Crafts</p>	<p>Making Dinosaur Bones</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make up a batch of basic salt dough. • Mix 2 cups flour, 1 cup salt, 1 cup water and stir until almost fully mixed. • Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and knead until smooth • Now start making bones of all shapes and sizes • Fill one large cookie tray with bones and another small one. • Then bake the pieces in a 250-degree Fahrenheit oven for about 3 hours or let air dry for a few days. • When they are done baking let them cool on the pan. Then carefully place them into a container. • Let the creativity begin!
